

TREE OR SHRUB PLANTING GUIDE

1. Dig a hole at least twice as wide as the tree or shrub's container. The hole doesn't need to be deeper, and wider is better.
2. Mix soil from the hole with an organic soil amendment. Nature life or peat moss should be mixed with the back-filled soil. These products will improve moisture retention.
3. Place the plant in the hole so that the plant's soil level is even with the surface soil level. Fill the sides with the amended soil. Take care not to break the root ball. Create a water well around the perimeter of the tree or shrub's planting hole.
4. Saturate the root ball immediately after planting with clear water. Then use Ferti-Lome Root Stimulator mixed per directions.
5. Water every day heavily for the first two weeks. Taper to twice weekly thereafter and twice a month in the winter. These are general guidelines. Sandy soil uses water more often than clay and summer heat and drying winds will necessitate more frequent watering until the plant is established.
